The 2009 Winterball season registrations generally are May - August for boys and girls ages 7-18. Games begin early in September and finish the weekend before Thanksgiving in November and are generally played on Sundays in the afternoon.

Promote good communication skills use this time to develop volunteers as well as the players

Encourage parents to learn to how to umpire either behind the plate or at first and third. This is also a great time to learn how to keep score. (Score is not kept in winterball but is a great time to learn how to do so)

Remember that Winterball is a time for training and development of not only players but Little League volunteers as scorekeepers, coaches, grounds crews and umpires.

Players will learn valuable tools that are important as they move up in a division or are just beginning their baseball careers playing each in different field positions and promote pitching and good mechanics. Remember **ROTATE YOUR PLAYERS** and **TRAIN** each in different positions.

NOTE: ALL PLAYERS MUST WEAR A PROTECTIVE CUP! (Majors, Minor A and B) Please coaches, make sure your players are wearing the required equipment; keep them safe!
