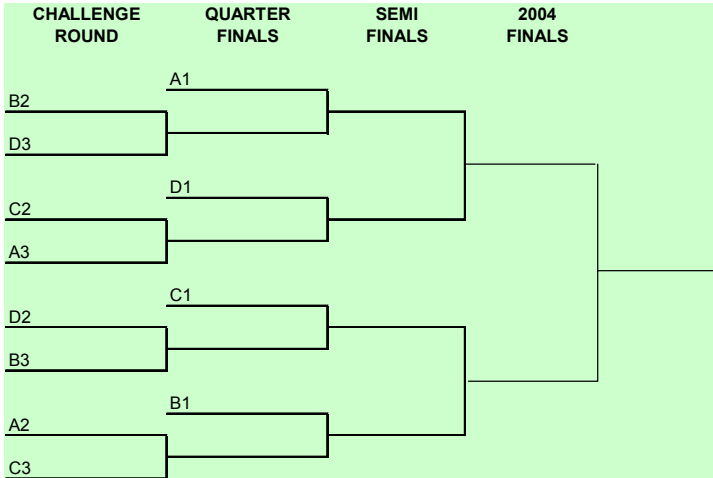

- Playoff Format:** We are going to use a format similar to NIRSA where the 2nd and 3rd place teams play in a challenge round match to advance to the quarterfinals. The only ties that will be broken (by a 1 game playoff) will be if 3 teams are tied for 2nd-4th places (teams will be seeded based on game percentage then point percentage with the 2nd place team getting 2nd place in the pool.....3 vs 4 will have a 1 game playoff to 15 point to decide 3rd place). A 3-way tie for first will be broken by game percentage followed by point percentage.



The tournament director and chief referee reserve the right to modify the format if need be.

TOURNAMENT PREVIEW

Favorites – Villanova, Lock Haven, Millersville

Contenders – Drexel, Eastern, Messiah, Princeton, West Chester, York

NORTH DIVISION

Lock Haven University, 2003 MACVC Runner-Up, raced through the competition in the North compiling a flawless record. Lock Haven returns the key players from last years team & looks to take the final step to win the Championship this year. *Lafayette College* has been a solid contender for the North division title in recent years but hasn't been able to climb over Lock Haven in the standings.

CENTRAL DIVISION

Villanova University, 2003 MACVC Champion, has a 32-5 divisional record over their past 5 seasons. Villanova has been a top contender to the Central title as well at the MACVC title. Villanova looks to retain the conference title which would make them the 6th back-to-back champion in the MACVC. *West Chester University* has compiled a 57-7 divisional record since 1996 and seeks that elusive Championship. West Chester is a team that nobody wants to face as they may have the dubious record of most 5 game losses against top ranked teams.

WEST DIVISION

Millersville University has compiled a 49-7 divisional record since 1996 and have always been a threat in the MACVC and Nationally to capture a championship. *Messiah College* has been in the 'Final Four' each of the past 3 seasons and 6 of the 8 since joining the conference. Look for Messiah to continue that string this year, they always come up big at the end of the season. *York College* has played almost every top MACVC team this year & has won their share of matches, look for York to make a strong push.

EAST DIVISION

The *College of NJ* has compiled a 33-3 divisional record since joining the MACVC in 1999. They have been the dominant team in the East over that period...until 2004 where they have been highly challenged by *Eastern University, Princeton University, Rowan University and Drexel University*. Eastern has been the most improved team in the MACVC in their 2nd season. Eastern won the St Joes tournament and a big road win over West foe Messiah has opened the eyes of the conference. They can't sneak up on anybody anymore! Princeton has quietly been a very strong team over the past several seasons. They should not be overlooked as they have the talent to beat anybody. Drexel has been a solid team in the MACVC and are looking to get into the quarterfinals for the first time. *Haverford* makes its first appearance in the championships in quite some time but have had memorable MACVC championships pulling several major upsets. They will be in comfortable surroundings at home, can they use this to their advantage? Rowan has been successful this season compiling a respectable record while playing competition throughout the MACVC, they have made a steady climb in the MACVC over the past seasons.

CONFERENCE HISTORY

The Middle Atlantic Club Volleyball Conference (MACVC) was founded in 1992 with 10 teams to provide a men’s intercollegiate club league for members of the NCAA Division III, Middle Atlantic Conference. The MACVC has continued to prosper and grow, merging with the Atlantic Men’s Intercollegiate Volleyball (AMIV) league in 1996 to become one of the largest & most competitive collegiate conferences in the country.

The MACVC provides area college club teams with a structured organization in which they can compete against collegiate teams with a similar level of play. Any college club teams interested in joining the MACVC needs to contact the conference in the fall where preparations for the spring season are made.

The MACVC is a recognized club conference within the National Intramural and Recreation Sports Association (NIRSA). NIRSA sponsors the collegiate club national volleyball championships. The MACVC has proven to be one of the best and most competitive Division II conferences in the country. While many teams have represented the conference at the National championships, several of the conference teams have put the conference on the map by their outstanding team performances at Nationals. The MACVC is also a charter member of the National Collegiate Volleyball Federation (NCVF). The NCVF is an organization dedicated to the promotion of collegiate men’s club volleyball. Each of the major conferences are members of the NCVF.
